

Section D: Calculating your Average Point Score

Your Average Point Score is a calculation of your Predicted/Actual Grades and will determine your A Level choice options.

Your Average Point Score will determine what subject options in Section E are available to you.

Average Point Score	How to choose your A Level/Level 3 Subjects
	(* Sports Studies BTEC- this will account for one, two, or three subject choices)
6+	Choose any 3 or 4 Subjects from any group. Facilitating subjects are favoured by many top ranking Universities. Your 4 th choice may be a 4 th A Level, Core Maths or an EPQ
5+	Choose 3 subjects, with a maximum of 2 Facilitating Subjects from Column 1. You should also choose 1 subject from Column 4
4+	Choose 3 subjects from Column 2 or 3. If you are predicted to achieve a 4 or below in English, then you may choose a maximum of 2 subjects from Column 2. Your third choice must come from Column 3. You should also choose 1 subject from Column 4
3.5+	Choose 3 subjects from Column 3 only . You should also choose 1 subject from Column 4.

Section G: Your Subject Choices

Based upon the subject choice guidance in Section F, now choose up to 4 subjects in order of preference.

We endeavour to ensure all students secure their preferred choices.

For students who do not achieve a '4' or above in GCSE English or GCSE Maths, a re-sit **must** be included as part of the curriculum and may have a bearing on their subject choices and number of A Level subjects taken in the Sixth Form.
