It took Blackburn Rovers 45 minutes of watching Harry Leonard to offer him a place in their academy when he was just 10. With interest from Leeds, Newcastle and Sunderland it wasn't the easiest of decisions, but five years later it has proved to be the right one.

Initially recruited as a midfielder with a strong defensive presence, Leonard's role has evolved in recent seasons.

A year into his time at Rovers he was made captain, a position he has retained in each of the age group teams for which he has played. After getting the armband, the lifelong Manchester City fan dedicated hours to understanding the leadership qualities of Vincent Kompany and other highly regarded captains.

In terms of performance, he has led from the front. Leonard has finished top goal scorer for his side in the past four seasons, doing so from a defensive midfield position for the majority of games.

At a recent lber cup, Leonard finished with a tournament - leading 12 goals from eight games, earning him the Golden Boot. Of all the players from across the thirty teams, he finished with the second highest player rating overall.

As for ambitions, Leonard has been aiming to try and establish himself in the older Rovers U18 team. In April he made a significant stride in the right direction, making his debut off the bench and even getting on the scoresheet.


PE SUPERSTAR
