GCSE History trip to Ypres- October 2017

This year heralds the centenary of the Battle of Passchendaele in World war One and to mark this occasion the History department is organising a cultural trip to the battlefields of Ypres and the Somme. The study of World War One is part of the Key Stage 3 curriculum and important in our understanding of sacrifice and remembrance. Students will be able to see first hand important sites as well as the trenches and themed museums. They will also have the unique opportunity to walk in the footsteps of a World War One soldier; spending the day in uniform and pack and sharing in a tommy tucker lunch. They will also create a legacy by making and dedicating a statue to a fallen soldier. These will be publicly displayed in Ypres in 2018. A suggested itinerary would include:

The trip will depart on Thursday 19 October (leaving at lunch time to minimise disruption to lessons) and will return on the morning of Monday 23 October. The cost of this trip will be £450 covering all transport costs (we will travel by coach and North Sea ferry Hull via Zeebrugge and the cost includes cabins and meals on the ferry), accommodation, all meals, visits, insurance and a guide.
