# **Curriculum News:**

#### **Biology Quiz**

On Wednesday 28th June, Mr Lee took four Year 12 A Level Biology students to the Royal Society of Biology Quiz at Myerscough College, Preston. Evan Kirk-Smith, Alex Twigg, Jo Eyles and Charlie Benson-Lee all did Rossett Sixth Form proud. During this long and challenging day, students were given ten difficult Biology Problems to solve. The competition was stiff to say the least, as we were competing against some of the top private schools in the country. But our fantastic Rossett Team did brilliantly well, scoring 712 points - the winners, Stonyhurst College, scored 770 points - so we were near the top! But our students brought so much more to the proceedings than the other teams, they competed with personality, enthusiasm and wonder at the biological world. A tremendous performance.

#### **Runswick Bay**

Year 12 A Level Biology students recently travelled to Runswick Bay, North Yorkshire to complete their fieldwork. Students undertook ecology investigations including: Do dog whelks increase with acorn barnacles? Do limpets prefer shale or shoreline? Does exposed bladder wrack have less bladders? Students even had time for a stone skimming competition and ice cream to finish off a fantastic visit.

#### **End of Year 12 Assessments**

Between 5<sup>th</sup> and 7<sup>th</sup> July, Year 12 students completed end of year 12 assessments for their A Level subjects. The grades awarded for these will go towards the student's UCAS predicted grades when applying for university courses in September. These assessments, along with the UCAS Exhibition and apprenticeship guest speaker visit mentioned above, support students in their Post 18 progression plans. Students are currently writing their personal statements and subject staff have been busy writing references for each Year 12 student. In September, Mr Durbin will be guiding students through the UCAS application process through a series of assemblies and Personal Development lessons.

# **AMA Oxford trip**

Our Year 12 Academically More Able group of students recently visited the University of Oxford. Students spent the night in student halls at Brasenose College, which dates back to 1509. Students learnt about student life and studying at a world class university. Last week Year 12 students undertook a week of work experience with employers from across the West and North Yorkshire and beyond. Students undertook placements in schools, hospitals, dentists, financial firms and marketing agencies to name but a few. Students returned to Sixth Form this week full of stories and reflections. Students not completing work experience placements supported staff and students for the Year 6 transition days and got involved with our 'Community Day' on Friday, including doing some fantastic work clearing garden spaces around school. Students also completed a 15-minute mock interview with two guest visitors from VQ Solutions. Well done to everyone.

#### **UCAS Exhibition**

On 15th June, 70 Year 12 students attended the UCAS Discovery Event at Leeds Beckett University. Students attended an exhibitor fair, which included 121 universities, alongside employers, apprenticeship providers and the armed forces. Students also visited a number of seminars on specific areas, from 'How to make your application stand out' to 'Understanding student finance', to specific subjects, including Law, History, Physiotherapy, Engineering and Sport Management.
