














Freddie Robinson broke the Year 8 Long
Jump record which now stands at 5.09m this was 2cm beyond the previous record
set 19 years ago of 5.07m by T.Watts.
Freddie also broke the record as a Year 7
boy with a jump of 4.32m

### English Schools for Smith

Issy Smith qualified and was selected to represent North Yorkshire in The English Schools' Athletics Championships in Birmingham.

Issy jumped a Personal Best of 10.89m in the Triple Jump to finish 3<sup>rd</sup> in Yorkshire and 30<sup>th</sup> in the England.





Issy also broke the Year 10 100m record at Sports' Day which now stands at 13.26 seconds. This record has stood for 28 years since T. Barker ran the distance in 13.47 seconds in 1991. Issy also broke the record last year as a Year 9 girl in the same event.

The Year 8 Boys' Cricket Team sailed through to the second round of the County Cup with a victory over St John Fisher's. St John Fisher's struggled to a below par 63-8 (16 overs) thanks to some excellent bowling and fielding from the Rossett boys. Skipper, Zac Houseman, showed all the signs of a great leader –in leading from the front, in a hostile opening spell. He was well supported by Sam Barker (Y7), Sam Raynard-Robinson and Will Harwood (Y7). Rossett openers Jack Hudson and Will Harwood made light work of the chase, leading Rossett to victory inside 8 overs, just as the rain came.

They went on to compete against Ripon Grammar School in the County Cup Final where the boys displayed some excellent fielding and bowling skills which restricted the high quality batting line up. Ripon 105-5 (Eddie Crossley 2-29 and Sam Barker 2-22. Rossett fell 14 runs short on 89-8 after Jack Hudson and Will Harwood were undone by some 'dodgy' bounce off the pitch. Sam Barker gave Rossett hope with 18 valuable runs but the boys fell just short. Ripon had a team of club cricketers including some North Yorkshire representatives, so this was a great effort and the team can be proud of the season they have had.

They have demonstrated a great attitude this year and have supported each other. Zac Houseman has led his team well and we are grateful for excellent contributions from Sam, Noah and Will stepping up from Year 7.

Well done Josh!




