Dear Students

Welcome back to the start of the summer term at Rossett School.

We hope that you and your families have had a peaceful and restorative Easter break.

As we told your parents/carers last term, we have started the remote learning for your lessons this week, and we have given you a couple of days to get started with your lessons on Teams.

There are specific letters going out to all of you in Years 10, 11, 12 and 13 (and your parents/carers) about the examinations this year at the end of this week. These letters will come from Mr Stone (Deputy Headteacher: Teaching & Learning) and will tell you more about:

- Your work or 'next steps' preparation this term
- How your work will be graded for your final examinations in summer 2020
- How to contact the school and who to contact if you have any queries.

For everyone else in Years 7-10 and also for Year 12, this week sees a return to **work as 'normal'** through your subject teachers' contact and the assignments posted to your account on Teams.

Your teachers have been asked to monitor when you log on; how much time you are spending on your work; and they are logging any incomplete work. If we think you are having trouble with your account or with the work, we may contact you or your parents to see if there are any particular difficulties that we can help you with or you can contact your SSO or DOL directly.

It is **really important** that you do keep on completing the work set for you.

Whenever our school is cleared to re-open, the teachers will be there to help you further with any work that you have struggled with, but there will not be much time to 're-teach' every subject to everyone. We are counting on you to **work independently**; be resilient in these difficult times; and to complete as many of the tasks set, to the best of your ability.

Well done to everyone who has managed to do this so well, before Easter. Let's keep the effort going this term as we tackle new topics and ways of working to make sure we are all ready to pick up where we left off, when we come back.

Those of you in Years 11 and 13 will no doubt be thinking about the progression choices you made for this coming September. Year 11 students will be receiving a letter from Mr Foley (Director of Sixth Form) that will give more details about your applications to Rossett School Sixth Form, but also advice and guidance for those of you who have indicated that you are choosing a different pathway. Any Year 13 students who are still unsure about your future destination, can access careers advise and information via <u>unifrog</u>. (Your username is your email address and you can select forgotten password if you can't remember the password).
